



Woodchuck Golf How to Play



Introduction

Woodchuck Golf is located at my home, 265 Palmer Lane, Waitsfield VT 05673

Tee times are required. <http://www.woodchuckgolf.com/request-tee-time>



There are no fees to play at Woodchuck Golf. I ask for a donation to the Food Shelf. There is a bin near #1 tee to drop off non-perishable goods. There is also a mailbox for cash or check donations.

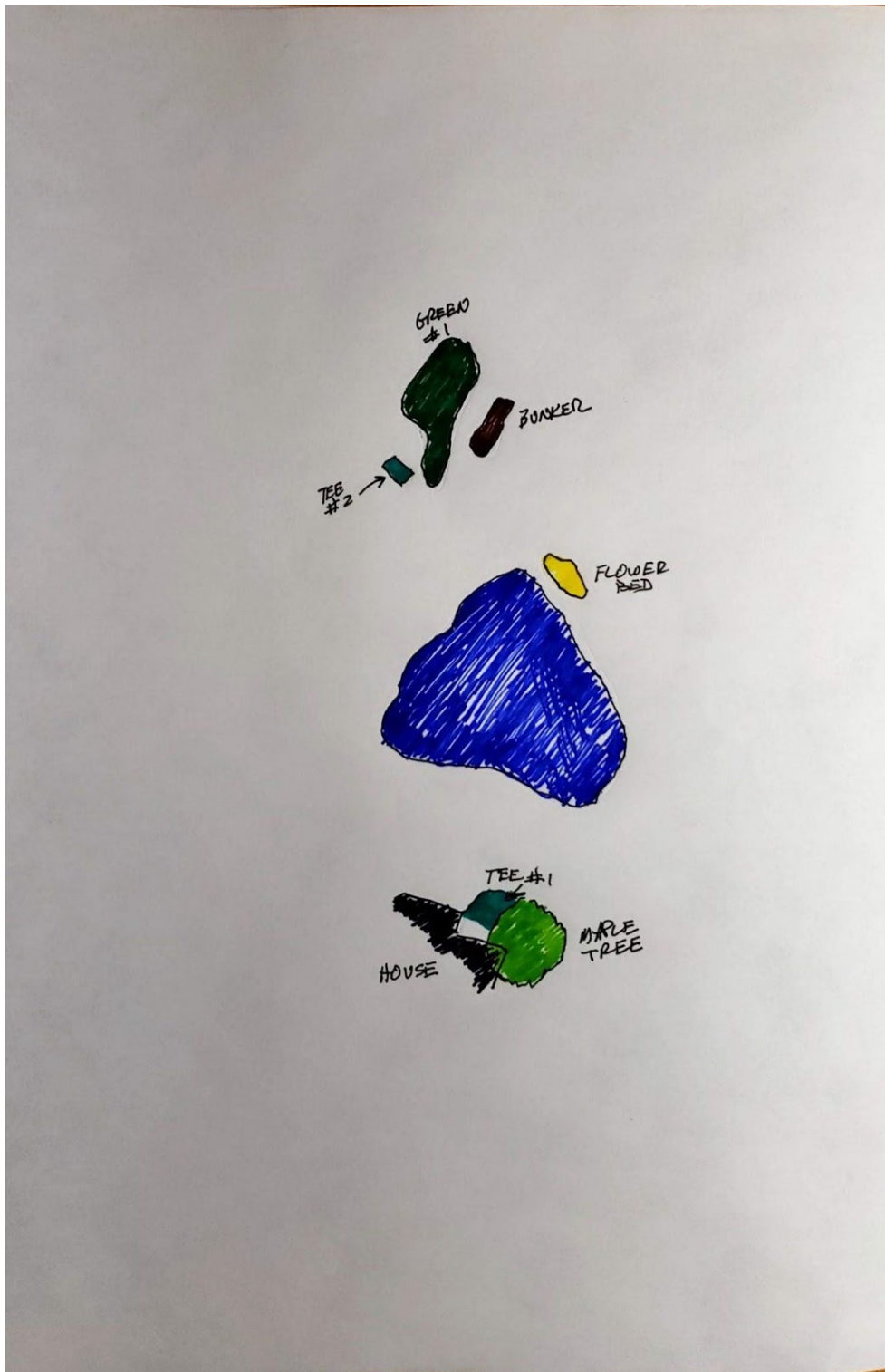
The first tee is located on the back side of the house on the driveway end. I don't have a driving range or practice area. The fairways criss-cross each other. For safety reasons, you should be the only players on the course.

There is no out of bounds. The entire course is red staked. There is a six stroke penalty for hitting the house. If you are on the wrong green or in the flower bed treat it as "ground under repair". You can't score more than nine on any hole.

The course record is one over par 21. Every hole has been birdied and #4 has been eagled three times. There has been one ace. If you set a new record or score an eagle or an ace, please let me know.

Hole #1 "The Postage Stamp"



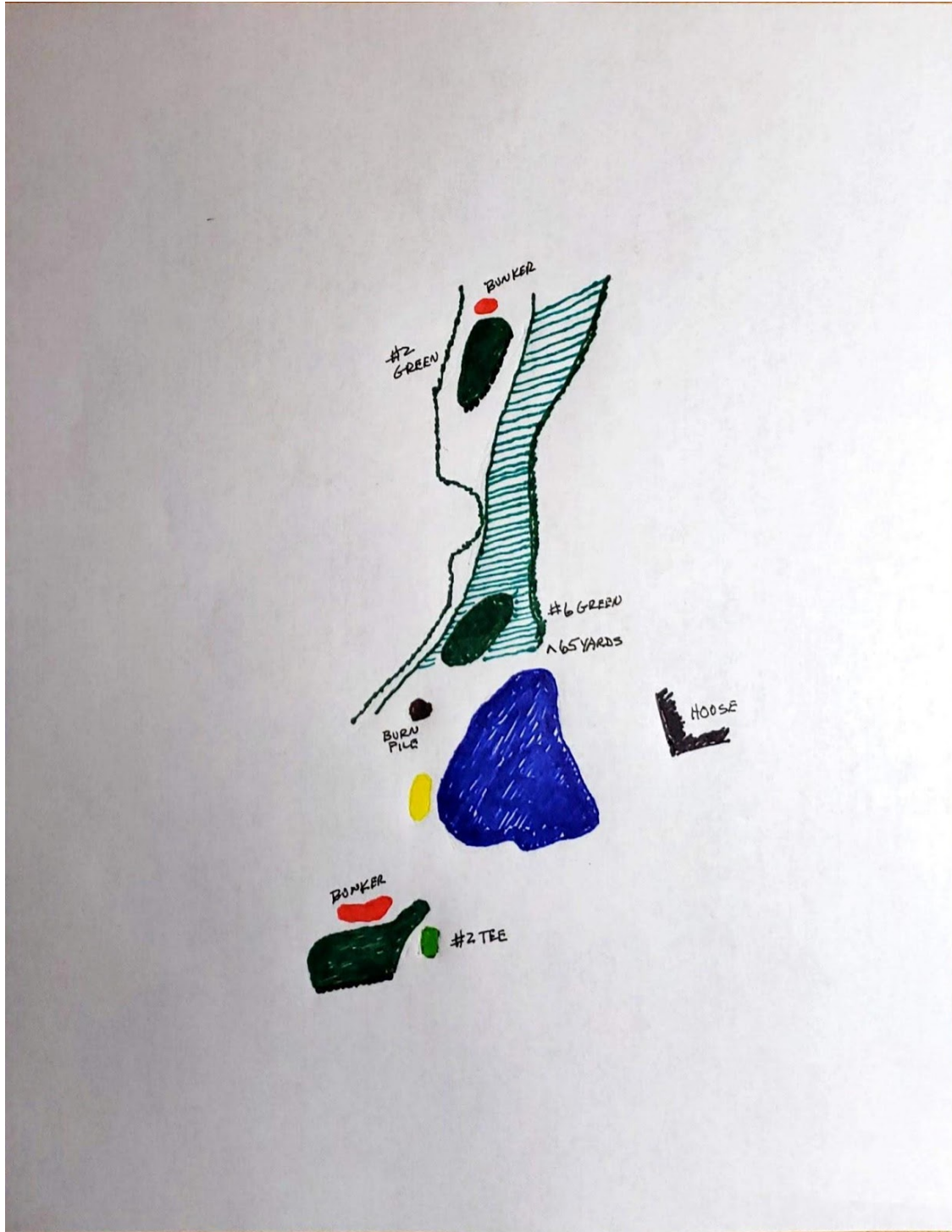
Hole #1 "The Postage Stamp"

On the first tee you can take two shots and play your best ball.

The good miss is short. Players that are good out of the bunker make it their miss. Long is bad and left and long is really bad. Even a little bit long or left is bad. To keep a ball on the green it has to go 100+ feet up and stick the landing.

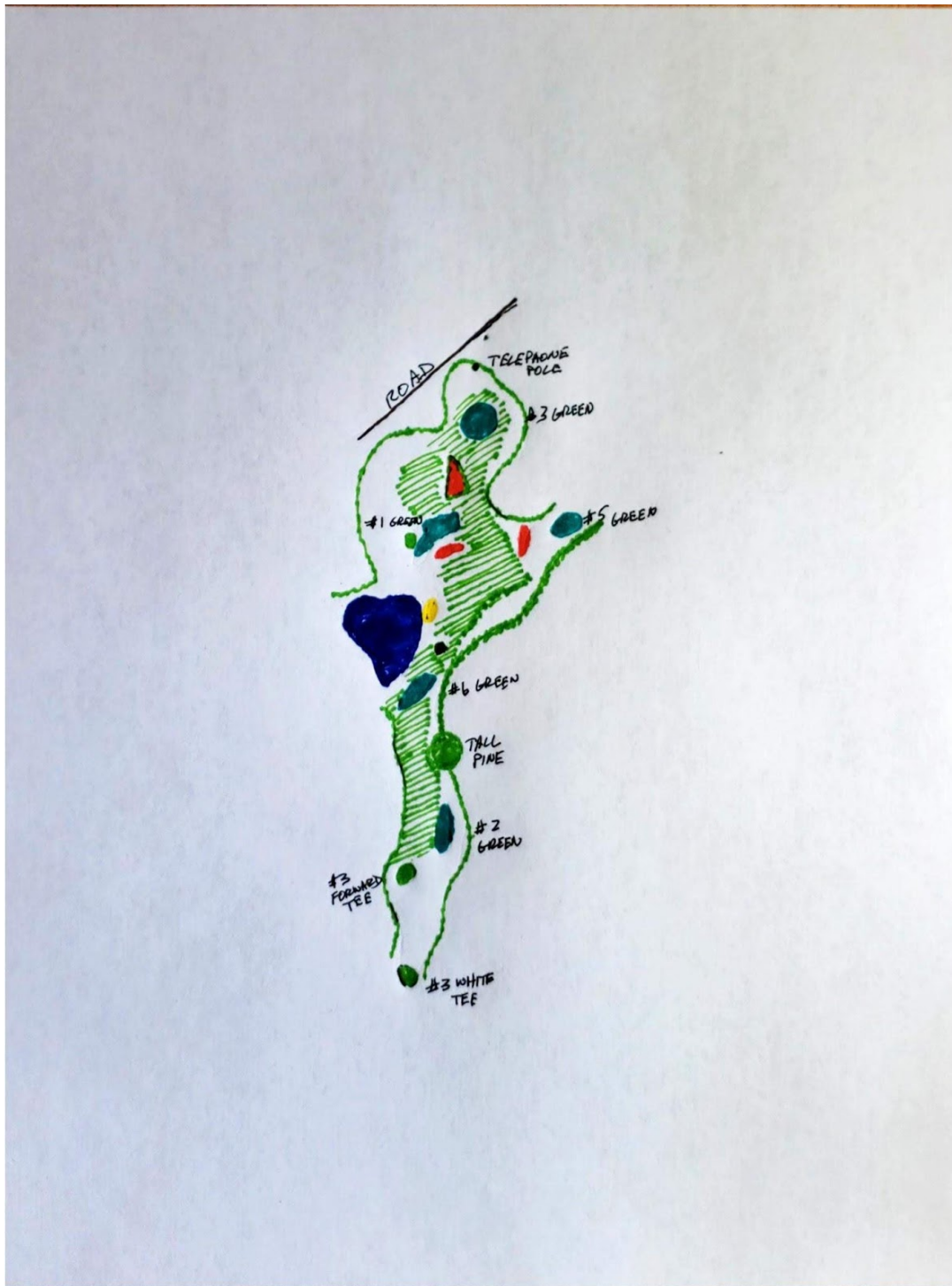
This is the view of #2 from the opposite side of green #6. From the #2 tee you can see part of the stone wall.



The green is narrow. There is 5-6 feet of rough to the left of the green then there is long grass.

Very few tee shots stay on the green. Most of the pars have come from tee shots off the green below the stone wall, then a good chip up to close to the pin.

Par 4 234 yards #5 handicap Forward tee

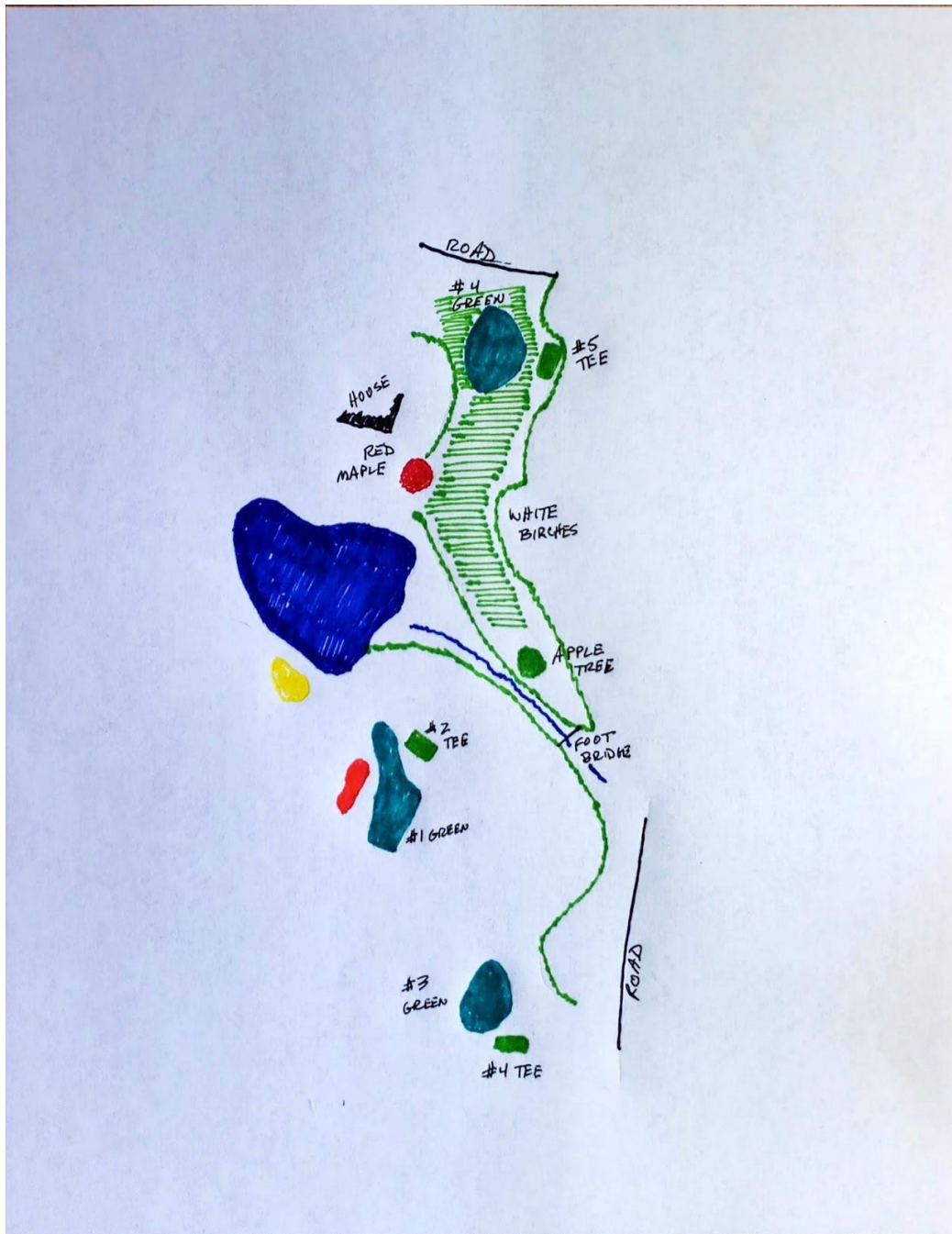


This is #3 green viewed from #1 green. From the far left side of #2 white tee you can see the top of the telephone pole with a transformer.



The aim point is directly over the tall pine tree. If you clear the pine tree still going up you will be on the flat area above the green. There is still 35 yards of tall trees behind the tall pine tree. If you go the the right of the pine you will have to carry an additional 40-50 yards. The bad stuff gets very close to the left of the green

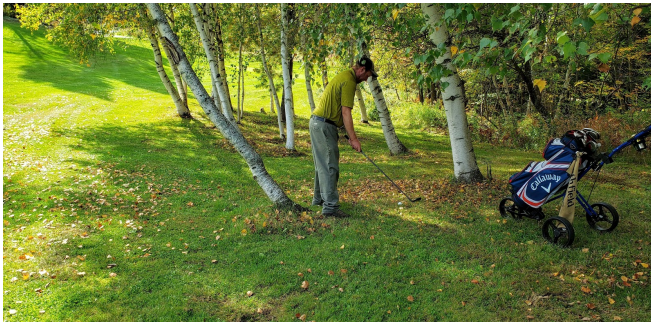

Par 4 183 yards #4 handicap



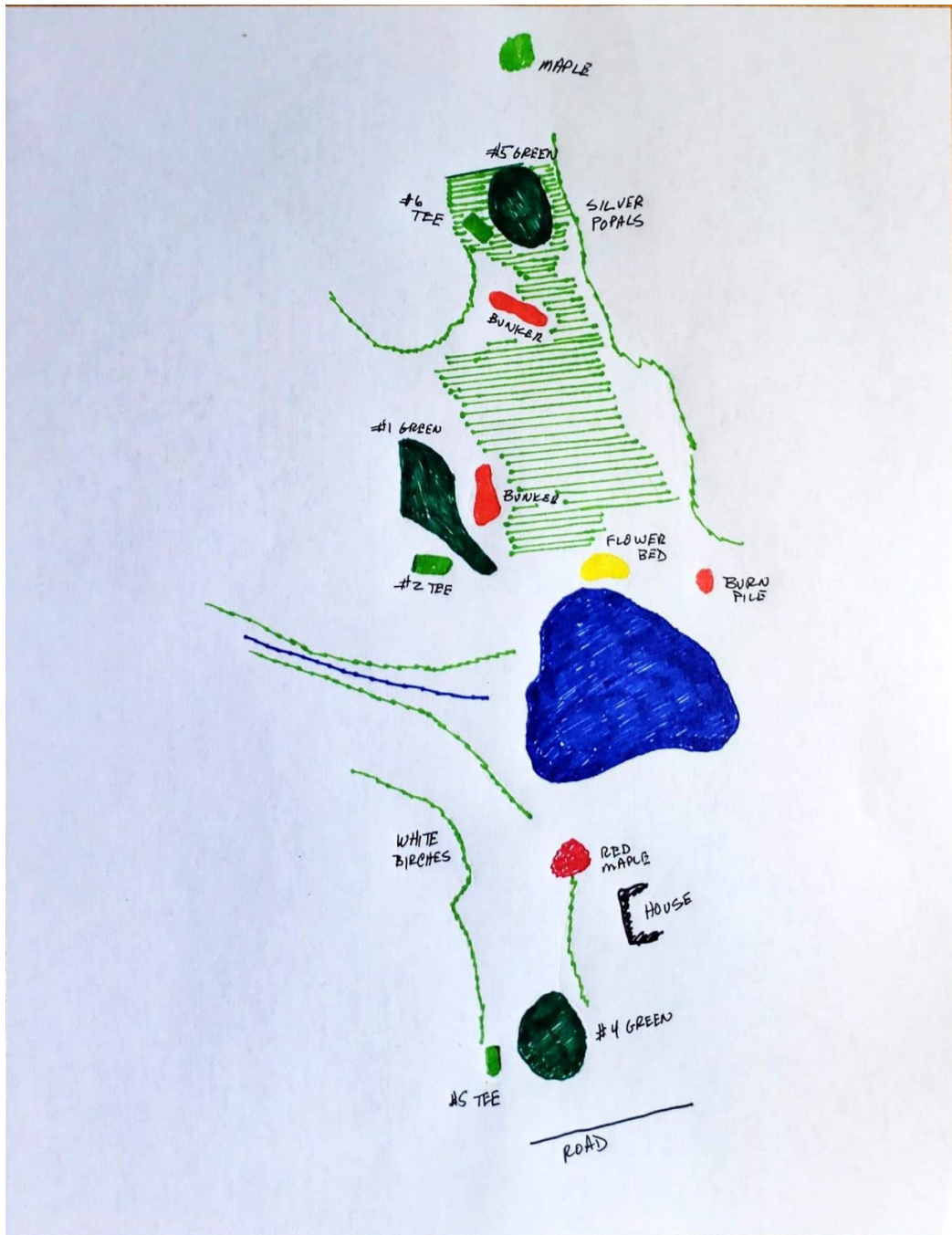
From the #4 tee this hole is to the right of the house and behind the white birches. There have been nine balls off the roof of the house...not to put anything into your head. The ideal shot is to just skim the left of the white birches. There is no fairway until you get to the birches. The fairway between the birches and the green slopes steeply to the right. There have been many good tee shots bound hard down the hill into

the long grass.



This is the view if you try and go thru the birches.

Par 3 193 yards #2 handicap



This is the view from the #5 tee. The ideal tee shot is a big looper over the pond drawing back to the green. There is a protecting bunker in front left side of this green that you can't see from the tee. The green runs away, so being a little long is OK. Most of the birdies and pars are from drives just past the pin.



This is the #5 front bunker that you can't see from the tee



The #5 green has two levels.

Par 3 119 yards #3 handicap



Green #6 is partially behind the burn pile



The ideal shot is over the right hand wheel of the rake. The ball will bounce slightly to the right.



There is very little space between the green and the pond and the ground slopes down to the pond sending balls into the long grass or the pond.
